The eight stages of development (prenatal, infancy, early childhood, school age children, adolescence, early adulthood, middle adulthood and later adulthood) should be considered. Multiple perspectives (biological, psychological, and socio-cultural, etc.) should be considered at each stage of development.

PSYC 291	Introduction to APA Style	2				Any psychology or english course designed to solely cover the use of APA style in academic writing.				
PSYC 322	Counseling and Clinical	3				Any upper division psychology course focusing on theories and techniques of counseling and therapy. Ethics should be a significant consideration.				
PSYC 325	Neuroscience	3				Any upper division psychology course focusing on the physical (e.g., brain, nervous system, etc.) basis of animal and human behavior (e.g., memory, attention, emotion, etc.).				
PSYC 370	Learning and Cognition	3				Any upper division psychology course focusing on learning and cognition. Two independent courses, one in learning and one in cognition, would also be acceptable as a transfer for this course.				
PSYC 371	Abnormal Psychology	3				Any upper division psychology course focusing on psychopathologies, "abnormal" behavior, mental illness, and therapeutic methods, approaches, and theories. With regard to the mental illnesses, definition, presentation, causes, and treatment should be considered.				
PSYC 415	Research Methods	4				Any upper division psychology course focusing on both qualitative and quantitative research methods in the social sciences. Acceptable transfer courses must involve critical reading of empirical research and development of a research program.				
PSYC 441	Environmental Perception & Human Development	3				Substitutions for this course are rare. Instances include psychology courses covering personality psychology from the perspective of the natural world.				
PSYC 445	Experimental Psychology	4				Acceptable transfers for this course are rare. Course material discussing advanced research methods and application thereof is required. Students must be required to design, complete, analyze data, and present via paper and poster a summary and discussion of their project.
